The **Gazoduq Project** becomes the first joint review project under the new **Impact Assessment Act**

FEBRUARY 2020

Proactive **safety advisory** issued about welds on high-strength steel pipe

APRIL 2020

CER introduces new process for **early engagement** on new project applications

JULY 2020

Joint agreement announced by the Indigenous Advisory and Monitoring Committee, the CER and the company to **improve Indigenous monitoring** of the Trans Mountain Pipeline Expansion

AUGUST 2020

Gitane De Silva welcomed as **new CEO**

AUGUST 2019

The National Energy Board is **replaced** by the Canada Energy Regulator with a new **Board of Directors and Commission**

FALL 2019

Joint inspections and oversight activities with **Indigenous Advisory and Monitoring Committees** for Trans Mountain Expansion and Enbridge Line 3

MARCH 2020

500+ CER employees start **working from home** due to COVID-19 while **maintaining business operations**

APRIL 2020

Develops new **protocols to oversee company activities** during the pandemic

AUGUST 2020

First **Indigenous Advisory Committee** established to help **build a new relationship** with Indigenous peoples
